JAMES COOK UNIVERSITY
POLICY REGARDING COMPUTER OR AARNET ACCESS
BY STUDENTS OF OTHER INSTITUTIONS

> This policy applies to all students of other institutions who request
> access to computing facilities for general use or to AARNet facilities
> to access their "parent" institution. The policy was instituted
> primarily to ensure that scarce facilities, particularly modem access,
> remain available primarily for use by James Cook students and staff.
>
> James Cook University will provide a "normal" computer account to
> students of other institutions only where the other institution has
> formally requested this and where the other institution is prepared to
> meet all normal external user charges. As with James Cook student
> accounts, such accounts will not normally have access to AARNet.
>
> In the case of students who wish to use AARNet to access computing
> facilities in their "home" institution, a "captive" account will
> be provided which will connect the student only and directly to a
> designated computer in their parent institution. There is a charge
> for provision of this service which is normally met by the student
> directly. The charge is \$100 per year or part thereof, payable before an
> account is issued. This is on a calendar year basis - i.e. each account
> will expire on 31 December irrespective of the date of issue, unless an
> earlier date is agreed in a particular case.

> Account names issued to students of other institutions are of the form:

> where x is the letter x to indicate eXternal
>
> iii is three letters identifying the institution to which the
> student belongs
>
