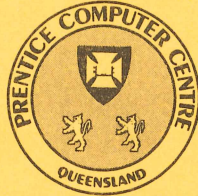

1. Newsletter Summary

- We apologise to users for inconvenience caused by the renovations taking place in our operations area on the ground floor of the Hawken Building.
- The Facit letter quality printer is available for hire (at \$2.00 per hour) but users must supply ribbons and print wheels which can be purchased from the Centre.
- The charging software for plotting on the VAX 11/780 system failed to charge some users for stationery and mounting non-standard pen carousels. This has been corrected.
- The new version of the Tektronics Graphics Kernel System (GKS) has been implemented.
- Purchase of STAIRS – an IBM package for the interactive manipulation of text database – will depend on the response of users during the current trial period.
- The CSIRO Cyber 76 will be decommissioned on 30 November. As a result there will be charges in the communications gateway to CSIRONET.
- Details are provided on courses for staff and postgraduate students.

The area in front of the new counter is intended to provide for manual sales and a more accessible client reference library. These will be set up as soon as practicable after the renovations are completed.

2.2 Letter Quality Printer

Regular users of the Facit letter quality printer will have noticed that it has become somewhat nomadic of late. After a short stay in the Eastern Hut adjacent to the

Credit Union (announced newsletter N-300), it has now returned to the Hawken Building. We believe this situation will be more convenient both for our clients and ourselves, as it will allow us to give access to the room without the need to loan out (and ensure the return of) keys.

Another problem with this service (and indeed with some others) is the increasing costs of consumables. The paper and ribbons used during a period of hire has cost us up to about four times the hire charge! Print wheels which have a fairly limited life are an additional significant cost. Therefore, from 1 July 1985 new charges for this service will apply. The basic charge of \$2.00 per hour will remain but users will need to purchase from the Centre the ribbons and print wheels they require. These cannot be hired or "part" purchased.

At this stage paper will continue to be supplied at no additional charge. Prices for ribbons and print wheels will reflect our buying price and unless there are further increases will initially be as follows:

Cloth ribbon	\$10.50
Carbon ribbon	\$12.50
Print wheel	\$12.40

Intending users should book this service either at the new main counter, the night counter, or by phoning extension 3024. The maximum contiguous period which may be booked is two hours. However, in the event of there being no following booking, this period may be extended.

2.4 New TEKGKS Version on UQVAX::

TEKGKS (announced in the May newsletter N-300) has been upgraded to version 2.0. For most users the changes will be transparent, however there is now support for Tektronix 4014 terminals. A Model Device Driver is supplied for those keen to support their own terminals. You can still link your programs to TEKGKS with the command

```
$LINK myprog,SYS$SYSROOT:[TEKGKS]SGKS/LIB
```

2.5 STAIRS on CMS

STAIRS is an interactive text database manipulating tool. It can be used for storage and retrieval of documents. STAIRS allows users to search for text strings, select records and order retrieved documents in order of relevance. On entry of a document into a STAIRS database the user can specify which words are to be used as keys in later searches.

There is a help facility built in and a "First Time User" tutorial is available while the user is running STAIRS. To run STAIRS simply type at CMS command level

STAIRS

STAIRS is currently **on trial** on UQVM and its subsequent purchase is dependent upon the reports of users who take advantage of the testing period.

To help us evaluate STAIRS users are requested to try it out and send their comments on its value to Allan Woodland at the Centre. Users are reminded that, at this stage, STAIRS is only **on trial** and users should not become dependent on it until a final decision is made on its acquisition!

3.1 New CSIRONET Gateway

As mentioned in a previous newsletter (N-296, January 1985) the current CSIRONET gateway will meet its demise when the CYBER-76 is decommissioned. The CYBER-76 decommissioning which was originally scheduled for 31 May has now been postponed to 30 November 1985.

After the CYBER-76 is decommissioned the current CSIRONET gateway will no longer be available and users will have to make use of a gateway based on a VAX. To assist users in becoming acquainted with the VAX based gateway and help them convert over to the new system there will be a period in which both gateways operate simultaneously. This period of simultaneous operation will begin as soon as Telecom install an additional communications line between the Centre and CSIRONET.

Details of the operation of the new gateway will be released in the next newsletter. In the meantime questions about the new VAX gateway to CSIRONET should be directed to Danny Smith (ext. 4079).

4.1 Information Concerning Courses

The following schedule of courses has tentatively been arranged for the period July – August, 1985:

July

Introduction to IBM	July 16-19 4 half days 9-12 each day
Conversion to IBM	July 23-25 3 half days 9-12 each day
Introduction to PDP-10	July 29-August 1 4 half days 1-4 each day

August

Introduction to IBM	August 6-9 4 half days 9-12 each day
SPSS	August 12-16 5 half days 9-12.30 each day
SQL	August 19-23 5 half days 9-12 each day

General Notes:

1. Intending users of the PDP-10 system must be familiar with the content of the course *Introduction to PDP-10* (i.e. terminal usage, file-management, editing) before attending other PDP-10 courses.
2. In corresponding fashion, for the IBM system, users should have attended either *Conversion to IBM* (for previous PDP-10 users) or *Introduction to IBM* (for completely new users) before attending other IBM courses.
3. Courses held at St Lucia (with the exception of CAD/CAM courses) are conducted in the Computer Centre's teaching area near the Physics Annex. Courses designated (GU) are held in Room 1.49, East Wing, SIA Building at Griffith University.
4. Staff and post-graduate students are admitted free to courses; all others pay at the rate of \$10.00 per half-day session.
5. Enrolments for all courses may be made by phoning ext. 3018.
