OPERATING REPORT 1989

INTRODUCTION

The most significant event in 1989 was the secondment for two years of our long-serving Director, Mr Alan Coulter, as Director of Development, and the appointment of Mr John Noad as Director of the Centre. This change led to a year marked by a major review, organisational change and rethinking of directions.

The Centre completed the financial year with a loss of \$112,000 against a budgeted loss of \$116,000. This loss will be covered by reserves from previous years.

1. OPERATING RESULTS 1989

Total revenue amounted to \$3,324,000 plus salary supplementation of \$28,775 (as calculated by the Bursar's office) which with total operating costs of \$3,436,000 allowed a transfer against reserves of a \$112,000 deficit. This result saw a rise of 6% in actual over budgeted revenue for 1989.

Operating costs were 7% over 1989 budgeted costs and 16% greater than the 1988 actuals. Revenue (excluding the charge to general fund for approved services) was 7% above 1989 budgeted revenue. Salary costs increased by \$156,000 (7.5%) whilst most other expenditure was below budget with the exceptions of consumables/spares, software charges, and staff development/travel.

One of the Centre's aims in 1989 was to increase staff training and development, and this led to an \$8,000 over expenditure on staff development and travel; similarly introduction of new software licences on the mainframe computers and the membership fee to join the IBM Higher Education Software Consortium (HESC) meant exceeding the budget by \$51,000 or 34%. However, membership of the HESC should mean reduced IBM software licence costs in future years. The major overrun for 1989 was the consumables/spares spending of \$435,000 against a budget of \$250,000. This increase in spending is due to a number of factors:

- (a) increase in PC maintenance for departments
- (b) increased parts costs especially for PDP-10 maintenance
- (c) spending on new equipment for further development of the network with no recovery
- (d) increased subsidisation of Telecom off-campus network links

Spending on PC maintenance parts was offset by revenue gained from this service, but was far greater than budgeted due to the increase in breakdown of the ageing population of PC's on campus. The cost of new equipment for the network, to advance into the newer communication technologies and to enlarge the capacity of existing equipment, represents over \$50,000 of consumables/spares spending. Funding for the purchase of UQ network equipment has never been given to the Centre, and, therefore, has always been paid from the Centre's recurrent funds as has the Telecom off campus data line subsidisation. In 1989 the Telecom subsidisation was approximately \$58,000 and will increase in 1990 with full costs for the Medical School and Gatton data lines.

Revenue Earned

Revenue earned from charged services was 25.8% higher than 1988. Revenue by user groups is detailed in Appendix E. Computing use revenue from Departments of UQ (including Innovative Teaching and Research Grants) increased by 6% and by 7% for UQ Administration. Griffith University computing use decreased slightly for schools and affiliates but increased by 32% for Administration. This increase in Griffith Administration computing use is a once only situation. Griffith Administration work will disappear in 1990 when they transfer their accounting system to their own mainframe.

Overall revenue from usage of central computing facilities increased by 3%. The major area of revenue increase was in contract work which was more than double the 1988 revenue. This was due to the Centre working on several large software contracts. These contracts will not continue into 1990. However the Centre has, through this work, gained recognition of its ability to provide outstanding support in all areas of software development, and hopefully should gain more contracts in this development area during ensuing years.

2. <u>SYSTEM STATISTICS</u>

During 1989, the Centre operated six host systems - DEC dual processor KL10, DEC VAX 8650, DEC VAX 8550, DEC VAX 11/780, IBM 3081, and a Computervision CAD/CAM system.

System performance statistics for the VAX Cluster and IBM 3081 are illustrated in Appendix G.

3. USER EDUCATION

A total of 89 courses attended by 964 staff and post-graduate students were offered in 1989. Much of the workload, during the latter half of the year, was accomplished by one full-time and one half-time Education Officer.

Of the 89 courses, 44 were mainframe courses and 45 were PC based courses. It is apparent from enrolments that the PC courses are extremely popular and are booked out within a period of 1-2 days after release of the timetables with an average of 6-8 people on each waiting list.

Mainframe courses for 1990 will include new Oracle database courses and the introduction of some "user pays" undergraduate PC courses.

4. <u>STAFFING</u>

Attracting experienced professional computing staff to the Centre during 1989, continued to be a problem, but one which is also being experienced in other sections of the University. Although we do not have the same problem attracting new graduates, the Centre is then left with a training problem and the further complication that these staff only seem to stay until they have gained 2-3 years of experience and can command a higher salary.

A new salary scale for professional computing staff was developed and submitted to the University during 1989 and, at this time, is still under consideration.

SUMMARY

The computer usage revenue figures give a clear indication of the decreasing use of mainframe computers and the increasing use of stand-alone machinery, such as Personal Computers.

Revenue from Other Educational Institutions and External Users has rapidly dwindled to such an extent that the figures now form a very small proportion of our overall computer revenue. During 1989, Griffith University removed their payroll system from the KL10 and will remove their accounting system from 1 January 1990. This will mean that, from 1990 onwards, the revenue from Griffith will dwindle away very quickly. Proposed changes to the present TE score system, may eventuate in losses of revenue from QTAC.

In the contract area, revenue continues to increase, and from 1990 the University has agreed to fund the campus-wide network as a strategic resource. This funding will stop the drain on the Centre recurrent funds which have borne the brunt of improving the network, for all campus users, since 1982. Advice and help to departments and staff on PC use and use of packages has increased dramatically over the past three years, to such an extent that an extra staff member is required to cope with the load, and this has been included in our 1990 Budget and hopefully, will be funded by the University.

Overall, the Centre is and has been introducing new services which provide substantial benefits to all University users.
